Redbridge Matters strongly condemns the attacks on the Bangladeshi community in the UK.

Redbridge Matters (RM) is deeply concerned by the offensive remarks about the Bangladeshi community made by Labour Leader Keir Starmer in an interview recently. Starmer singled out Bangladesh when specifically talking about people who come to the UK illegally. His comments were backed up by shadow cabinet minister Jon Ashworth, who said the Labour government would send migrants "from countries like Bangladesh" back to their countries of origin. Again, he singled out Bangladesh.

If this is allowed to continue, then other minority communities in the UK from different countries will also be singled out in the future. That's why unjustly targeting one minority community is tantamount of targeting them all, which cannot be accepted and must be condemned.

This is why RM have already stated that the mainstream parties especially Labour no longer represent us. We have therefore decided to endorse only independent candidates in Redbridge for the General Election on 4th July.

Finally, we emphasise that all those who are trusted for political office must be held accountable for their irresponsible comments because unguarded generalised comments targeting a single ethnic minority with the aim of political scoring is dangerous and likely to undermine community cohesion.
